

Theater Grants, Sports Festivals and Awards

Grants from the first Omni Theater Festival will be announced Thursday night at Ruth Foreman's North Miami Playhouse. Many South Florida theaters are in competition for the funds... and speaking of donations, the Friends of the Playhouse, a support group of the Coconut Grove Playhouse, gave \$500 each this year to Ruth Foreman and the Bary College Drama Department. Other donations from that organization include \$1,500 to the Omni Theater Festival, \$500 to the Players Repertory Theater and a \$375 donation to purchase Actors' Equity cards for two promising college students...

Nat Chediak, producer of the Merry-Go-Round Cinematheque in Coral Gables, will be operating seven nights a week beginning next Friday, instead of only week nights. Pascal Thomas' "Don't Cry Out With Your Mouth Full" will be the first feature shown under the new policy... Miami Mayor Maurice Ferre turned up at the M-G-R one night recently and handed Chediak a check for \$500. The money was part of a \$2,500 fee that Andres Segovia had received for playing Miami recently. The guitarist had donated the fee to the city and asked officials to select several cultural facilities and divide the money among them. After handing over the check, Ferre took a seat in the first row and watched the feature "Therese Desqueyroux."

Two major South Florida theater producers were represented on late-night television Thursday. Robert Fishko's commercial for "Equus" at the Coconut Grove Playhouse was brief and provocative, and on the ABC Wide World of Entertainment, Zev Bufman's special "Fantasies Fulfilled" showed the wishes of average people coming true...

Alex Ben Block, former entertainment editor of The Miami News, and his new wife, actress-writer Jodi Taylor of Fort Lauderdale, are living in Coconut Grove. Besides working on a book on psychics, Block is promoting a festival called American Super Sports, to run Aug. 19-24 at Miami Beach Convention Center. "It's really sports as theater," says Block. "Media personalities will narrate demonstrations by sports figures. It's like the Olympics, the circus and the state fair rolled into one"...

Matty Tylek, formerly of Florida State Theaters, has been appointed executive vice president at Howard Pettingill and Associates, Inc., a Miami advertising firm... Miami actor Fred Buch, featured in the Hav-A-Tampa cigar commercials on television, is now appearing as the friendly teller for First Federal Savings and Loan Association as Anita Bryant hums their praises...
